5-Star. Best Rating! Opposing team was absolutely super and one of the best to play. Equivalent to an "A" in academics.

<u>**4-Star</u>**. Target Rating! Opposing team was a pleasure to play. No problems whatsoever. Equivalent to a "B" in academics.</u>

<u>3-Star</u>. Average Rating. No major problems, but possibly a minor issue or two. In the end, your team still had a good night out. Equivalent to a "C" in academics.

<u>2-Star</u>: Poor Rating. Multiple problems. Night out wasn't so fun. Equivalent to a "D" in academics. Suggest submitting a "Sportsmanship Complaint" form on the web.

<u>1-Star</u>. Totally Unacceptable. <u>Must be accompanied by submission of the</u> **<u>"Sportsmanship Complaint" form on the web</u>** (within 48 hrs of the incident). Without a form, score bumps to a 2. Equivalent to an "F" in academics.

Examples of Great Sportsmanship

1. Congratulating your opponent on a great shot!

 3. Reminding your opponent about pertinent rules... for example, reminding your 8-Ball opponent to mark his/her pocket or reminding your 9-Ball opponent which ball he/she is shooting.
- 4. Live up to your fouls... for example, if you knowingly make a bad hit, pick up the cue ball and hand it to your opponent.

Examples of Poor Sportsmanship

- Rude or offensive language...for example, profanity or racist remarks.
- Making degrading remarks about your opponent's skill level.
- 3. Sandbagging.
- Intimidating behavior such as aggressive handling of the balls or cue stick.
